This new scanner can be used to help identify a wide range of bladder issues and reduces the risk of catheter-associated UTIs.

Kristi Powers, RN, visited with the WNHF board members at their meeting on October 28 to give more information on the camera's purpose and the importance of the camera to the department and to WNH, namely how this camera can aid substantially in providing clear and in-depth evidence of abuse to be used in court.
