IMPROVING QUALITY CARE: THE IMPACT OF WNHF MINI GRANTS

To celebrate last year's mini grants and highlight how the funds are being used to improve care provided at WNH, we asked some of our department directors to submit a short update on the impact their mini grant has had on their department. We featured them on our bulletin board outside the Kitchen on Fifth, but we also wanted to share them with you! Catch the next newsletter to read more mini grant success stories.

FAMILY BIRTHING CENTER

The Nellcor N-595 is a wonderful pulse oximeter that is much more accurate than most pulse oximeters. It allows us to capture the infant's heart rate and oxygen saturation much quicker and more accurate than other machines. This in turns allows us to treat the patient quicker which makes for a quicker recovery for the patient. We delivered 298 babies in 2019 and 293 in 2020, meaning this machine has the opportunity to affect around 300 families a year.
