IMPROVING QUALITY CARE: THE IMPACT OF WNHF MINI GRANTS

To celebrate last year's mini grants and highlight how the funds are being used to improve care provided at WNH, we asked some of our department directors to submit a short update on the impact their mini grant has had on their department. Check out what marketing did with their grant below!

MARKETING

We used our mini grant funds to purchase a gimbal stabilizer for our camera. While a camera stabilizer doesn't directly impact patient care/patient safety, it is a great tool we can use to connect with our patients, highlight our hospital, and essentially put us a step above other rural hospitals. While it takes a little bit of a learning curve to learn how to use it correctly, having the Gimbal at our disposal will allow us to create virtual/walking tours of all areas of the hospital. We can easily create virtual walk-through tours of patient care areas such as OB (watch for this video coming out soon!), Rehab, 2East, Surgery, ER, Admissions, new facilities, and future phases of the Second Century Campaign, creating a sense of transparency



and peace of mind for our patients before they even step in the building. We also hope to put it to use at events like the WNHF Gala or future grand openings/community events. - Sarah & Kylie
