FOLLOW UP: SANE CAMERA FUNDING

The SANE camera was listed in the last issue of 'Connect During COVID' (Issue #7) as a current funding need - total amount needed is nearly \$40,000. The SDFI system (more info shown in the image below) will allow our team to take high resolution photos to use as evidence and provides options for high quality editing and secure methods of sharing information with the appropriate forensic specialists, attorneys, etc. WNH house supervisor Kristi Powers provided the following information to explain more about the presence of sexual assault cases in our area. Since 2008, our team has performed 376 exams.

To compare to what is happening in the nation:

Nationally, over 90% of sexual violence cases are **not reported**. Every **73** seconds, an American is **sexually assaulted**; Every **9** minutes, **that victim is a child**.

Research of the specific types of violence during and following emergencies is limited and often combines domestic and nondomestic sexual violence.

For more than six weeks, the world has been consumed with talks of the global pandemic and subsequent lockdowns caused by COVID-19. As quarantine and stay-at-home efforts drag on, a second, silent pandemic persists. Evidence shows that rates of sexual violence increase during states of emergency, including natural disasters, active conflict, and health crises. For example, reports indicate that sexual assault increased by 45% during Hurricane Katrina and the recovery period. The stress, fear and sense of helplessness associated with emergencies tend to increase risk factors for perpetration of violence against women. The 2005 report of the World Health Organization (WHO) tells us that "there is a pattern of gender differentiation at all levels of the disaster process: exposure to risk, risk perception, preparedness, physical response, impact, psychological impact, recovery and reconstruction."
