MESSAGE FROM THE HERITAGE SOCIETY: PATTY KELLY NEISES

Patty is one of the newest members of the WNH Heritage Society, and we are fortunate to have her on board.



In my work as a CPA, I am continually amazed at the generosity of clients who firmly believe in "paying it forward" sharing their blessings with nonprofits such as the William Newton Healthcare Foundation (WNHF). Clients are always looking for a tax-efficient method to fulfill their charitable wishes, and prefer to "keep it simple."

One asset that is often overlooked is utilizing an IRA, regardless of your age. Under current tax law, an IRA is a great vehicle for simple, tax-efficient gifts. For donors over 70½ years of age, making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly from your IRA can allow you to receive the full tax benefit of your charitable contribution, while maintaining the benefit received from the increased federal standard deduction. For those under 70½ years of age that want to make a planned gift, you can add the WNHF as a partial beneficiary on an existing IRA. Another option is to make a direct IRA rollover of funds to a new IRA specifically for charitable gifts and list the foundation and other charities as the sole beneficiary on the new "charitable" IRA.

An IRA paid to the foundation at your death is nontaxable since the foundation is a tax exempt organization. Individual beneficiaries of IRAs are taxed on the proceeds at ordinary income tax rates; therefore, including your favorite charities as an IRA beneficiary both reduces tax due by your heirs and fulfills your charitable wishes – a win-win! Tax laws change frequently, so be sure to discuss your options with both your tax advisor and IRA custodian.

ANONYMOUS DONOR MAKING AN IMPACT

An anonymous donor recently gave a large donation that will directly impact the patient experience in four hospital departments! Their intention with the gift was to help fund immediate needs within the hospital that haven't fit in past budgets, including larger wish list items that will benefit not only the patients in these departments but the employees providing care every day. WNH AWARDED COMMUNITY SERVICE TAX CREDITS

William Newton Hospital will receive funding through the state of Kansas Community Service Tax Credit program in the amount of \$197,500 towards the purchase and installation of a new call system, offering improved communication and increased efficiency of patient care. The hospital is among 26 Kansas nonprofits receiving \$4 million in Community Service Tax Credits in order to improve and enhance fundraising efforts for education, healthcare, childcare, and housing projects.

In a July 16 news release, Governor Laura Kelly said, "The Community Service Tax Credit program is an excellent tool we can use to support our state's nonprofits and strengthen the essential services they provide to their communities."

William Newton Hospital has a long history of success with the program. In 2009, 2016, and 2019, the William Newton Healthcare Foundation successfully raised the maximum tax credits awarded. Most recently, the Cardiac Care in Our Heartland project helped fund new equipment for the cardiovascular catheterization lab which opened in 2020. The "cath lab," located within the H. L. Snyder Medical Foundation Surgery Center, diagnoses and treats many cardiac patients that would otherwise have to go to Wichita. "Our cath lab increases accessibility to necessary cardiovascular care in Winfield and the surrounding areas and has the potential to save lives," states William Newton Hospital CEO Ben Quinton.

The 2021-2022 project entitled Calling for Quality Care: WNH Nurse Call System will ensure patient needs are met through timely and efficient communication technology. The tax credits will provide \$335,750 of the total project budget of \$457,904. The current call system was put in place more than 16 years ago, with a few modifications over the years to improve performance. However, hospital staff say it's time for a replacement.

The most notable impact will be on staff responsiveness.

"IT'S SIMPLE. OUR NURSES NEED THE RIGHT TOOLS TO PROVIDE THE BEST CARE. THIS PROJECT WILL NOT ONLY EASE THE BURDEN ON OUR DEDICATED CAREGIVERS, BUT HELP THOUSANDS OF PATIENTS AND FAMILIES," MORRIS SAYS.

"The functionality of the system has been breaking down. There are no alternative solutions. It simply needs to be updated," shares Chief Nursing Officer Debbie Marrs, BSN, RN.

The new system will connect all nursing units, improving communication, accountability, efficiency, and patient safety throughout the hospital. To help nurses and aides respond from wherever they are, staff will have individual wireless phones instead of calls routed to a central line. The estimated number of beneficiaries among three nursing units, Med/Surg, OB, and ICU, would be over 1,100 patients per year.

William Newton Healthcare Foundation Director Annika Morris says the most notable impact will be on staff responsiveness. "It's simple. Our nurses need the right tools to provide the best care. This project will not

only ease the burden on our dedicated caregivers, but help thousands of patients and families," Morris says.

Nursing staff and information technology will work together to ensure no disruptions to patient care during implementation. Target completion for the entire project is December 31, 2021.

Community members in Cowley County and the surrounding counties can help by contributing at least \$250 through December 31, 2022. These 70 percent tax credits are awarded on a first-come-first-serve basis. To contribute, please contact the foundation office at 620-222-6275.

and oxygen level. While we already have a
few dinamaps in the center for patient care,
we still do not have enough to meet the
needs of a growing surgery center. Having
three additional dinamaps will provide
quicker access to a critical piece of patient
care equipment and will save the time
currently needed to track one down, especially
during times of high patient volume.



REHAB SERVICES

+ Remediation & remodel of the 1927 space to perform needed improvements and fix water penetration issues that have affected several rooms



MED/SURG - 2EAST

+ 12 bed mattresses - Our current mattresses are over 15 years old and are starting to show their age. New bed mattresses will mean better comfort for our inpatients during their stay.

FAMILY BIRTHING

CENTER

+ 5 Sleeper couches/chairs for significant others/visitors

- + **5 Cribs** New cribs will allow mothers easier access to their baby from the side of the bed, and will update old, broken, & noisy cribs.
- + Additional Panda Warmer Will come with a neopuff (an infant rescuscitator designed to deliver controlled, consistent, and precise pressures independent of operator experience) and will allow for safer and quicker resuscitation. It also has internal safe stops to help both newer and experienced staff.

- + Education Access to continued education will help our nurses gain valuable NICU experience, eventually allowing us to take care of more high risk newborns at William Newton Hospital without having to transfer them to other hospitals for care.
