## WNHF GALA AMONG EMERALD AWARD WINNERS



William Newton Hospital was recently recognized for excellence in public relations and marketing efforts by the Kansas Association of Health Care Communicators through its annual Emerald Awards competition.

The 2023 Emerald Awards, including 19 Emerald Awards and 17 Certificates of Merit, were presented at the KAHCC spring conference in Manhattan, Kan. 

#### WINFIELD'S 150TH CELEBRATION

William Newton Hospital helped celebrate Winfield's 150th birthday in early June. Our Grand Parade entry celebrated the hospital approaching a century of quality local healthcare in Winfield. Titled "We Are William Newton," our float and accompanying vehicles highlighted our rich history and included the William Newton Hospital Auxiliary, established in 1933, and the William Newton Healthcare Foundation, established in 2007. Also featured were EagleMed LLC's dedicated ground unit, Willy's Care Cab, William Newton Rehabilitation Services, and William Newton Family Birthing Center.









The foundation and auxiliary also participated in the old fashioned carnival, joining forces to create a fishing game to help represent the new Bass N' BBQ event.

### **BIKES, TRAINS, & AUTOMOBILES**

The hospital hosted a new Bikes, Trains, & Automobiles event on June 16 in partnership with several local entities. As part of the Beats Go On Community Wellness Initiative's mission to save lives one heartbeat at a time, foundation staff were on hand to help spread awareness, preventing trauma and trips to the ER through community education surrounding bike safety, train/railway safety, and car seat checks/education.

- + Our car seat techs checked 5 car seats and distributed 2 seats
- + 3 kids and their parents took part in a bike ride with Walnut Valley Outpost and had an opportunity to see a train up close thanks to our Watco crew
- + Winfield Fire/EMS Department stopped by to help cool everyone off
- + AND we got to learn about the many things RISE Cowley, Winfield Public Library Winfield, KS, and K-State Research and Extension Cowley County can do for the communities we serve. Thank you to all involved!



#### BASS N' BBQ

Our first annual Bass N' BBQ Fishing Tournament & BBQ Contest, in partnership with the City of Winfield, KS, raised over \$1,700 for the foundation in support of William Newton Hospital.
