**Construction Update** 

We have some hard hats on hand, if any of you would like to view the progress. Please see below some updates from Les McDarty, Director of Plant Operations.

central Supply: The department is now located in the footprint previously occupied by pharmacy on the first floor. Demolition of the Central Supply storage area is near completion and upon completion construction of the new offices will begin. The new CS storage construction is currently underway with installation of exterior concrete masonry walls. The CMU wall construction should complete within the next eight days. Installation of the metal roof joists supports will follow along with the roofing. The new CS storage area will be in the dry by mid-March with total project completion and ready to move into by 1-June. CS will have new shelving to properly store and maintain all commodities and will also provide smart space saving features to manage these inventories.

Surgery Addition: Currently, the concrete exterior walls are under construction. Concrete will be pumped into the forms containing steel reinforcement and these walls are projected to be completed within 3 weeks. The entire concrete floor and construction of the internal concrete masonry walls will follow. New surgery area is projected to be in the dry by the end of May with entire construction completion of this area scheduled for October.

**Existing OR Waiting Room:** The waiting area has been relocated to a partitioned area within the front Lobby area. Relocation of the existing OR waiting room opens up an area allowing construction startup of the new sterilization department in Phase I of the project.
