As a clinic manager, purchasing and upgrading medical equipment can sometimes be very costly, and the high costs can be a barrier to improving the ways we can care for our patients. Being affected by purchasing freezes, and very tight budgets, we sometimes must get creative with the ways we can provide funding for new equipment.

Thankfully, our community has a very valuable resource available the for advancement of healthcare: The H. L. Snyder Medical Foundation, In September 2023, The Snyder Foundation generously awarded William Newton Pediatrics with a grant in the amount of \$2.504.36 for the purchase of a SOFIA diagnostic machine. This machine will be able to diagnose children with RSV. Flu, strep throat, and many other diseases without the need for our patients to leave our office, thanks to the machine's ability to provide fast and accurate results.

Earlier this spring, the Snyder Foundation also presented the clinic with a \$1,000 grant to purchase a medical-grade freezer used for the storage of immunizations.

Dr. Peters, the entire clinic staff, and myself are extremely grateful for the Snyder Foundation's generosity, and we appreciate their care and dedication to ensuring that William Newton Hospital and William Newton Pediatrics offer the best possible patient care.
