## THE GOOD NEWS

+ Over \$7,500 was raised from just year-end giving!

+ The Wine-O Trail Run, one of our two annual record-breaking fundraising events, will return for its 10th year on May 21! + As of today, all tax credits for our 2021-22 project - Calling for Quality Care: Nurse Call System - have been sold! The new system, which will benefit Med/ Surg, ICU, OB, and the SANE rooms, is in the process of being setup now. This is a big positive for staff & patient safety!

+ The WNH Auxiliary contributed \$41,700 to the WNH Healthcare Foundation this year and are just \$6,600 from reaching their \$250,000 pledge commitment – almost paid off a year early.

#### Positives from nursing departments:

+ 2-East received a new patient lift thanks to our donors. This has alredy made a huge impact on our patient satisfaction and patient/staff safety.

+ ER has added APRN's to help in busy times.

+ ICU added TeleTechs to their care team.

+ A large donation from an anonymous donor will impact several WNH departments, including surgery, rehab, med/surg, and OB, through equipment purchases and facility improvements. Some equipment has already been delivered and is making a huge impact on patient care.

+ OR received new scopes. **Also, the OR is currently fully staffed!** This is a goal all nursing departments are striving for in 2022!
